Fourth & Fifth Grade Students in Broward County schools, public and private, are invited to submit their original art for consideration for the Sixth Annual Everglades Eyes Children's Art Competition at Old Davie School.

Old Davie School, in partnership with Central Broward Water Control District, will continue its annual celebration to honor Earth Day, April 22, 2012 by bringing attention to the canals and waterways of Broward County and the abundant wildlife living in the Everglades.

Work must be original, not a copy of another artist's work. Art must capture an image or images of Broward County waterways and may include canals, lakes and the Everglades. People, pets and wildlife images within this context are welcomed. Mediums may include oil, watercolor, pastel, and acrylic painting, mixed media, photography and collage. Maximum size: 11x17 inches.
